

The Chit System

The confirmation of attendance system, often called “the chit system” is simply a scheme to let people have some document to show that they have attended a particular meeting. That person can then give the confirmation to offender managers, Social Services, employers or any other body.

The system was endorsed by Conference 1987 as being within the Traditions, and operates without compromising anyone’s anonymity. It is up to the person requesting the chits to report on themselves to whoever is supervising them.

In Cornwall we can supply any group with “chits” which are distributed in an envelope which contains a slip with the group number and the Intergroup details. The member handing over the “chit envelope” needs to check the envelope is sealed and write the date over the seal so that it can be verified by the body requesting the chit.
